EASTER BUNNY

Jacqui Barber has sent us her Easter Bunny pattern for you all to enjoy. You can choose from lots of colours and any combination of stitches. This sample is made in DMC Special Dentelles 80. The body needed 4 passive pairs and one worker, and the ears each required 6 passive pairs plus a worker. Cover the start and finish point with a fluffy bobtail!





7 pairs Sylko.

This motif has been worked in a variety of stitches – ½st with dbls on each edge for ears, wat for head, dbls for body, ½st with dbls on outer edge only for tail – other combinations could be used.

Start at A with 4prs laid across the pin, work as for Candle flame, adding pairs at the next 3 pins.

Turning stitches will be needed at B, C, G & H.

Change to wst at B and discard one pair (by turning two bobbins to the back of the pillow).


For the whiskers tw wks 4 or 5 times going out to the pin and 4 or 5 times back.

Discard another pair on the row before C then change to dbls.

At D change to 1/2st with dbls on outer edge and at E sew off to edge of braid and Bruges tie (see Q.3c).

Start second side with 4prs on F and work to match first, making sewings where the two sides touch.

For a turning stitch the wks work a wst or dbl with the inside pair which then becomes the wks for the next row.





Stitches at change from head to body





Pattern for working in Sylko

SITTING RABBIT

by Pam McPoland from her book, Lace Cards for Young People

- Start at 'a' with 3 pairs of 16/2 brown linen thread, and work round the head.
- Then join in the 3 pairs at 'b' and work round the body to 'c' and tie in.
- Join in 3 pairs at 'd' and work round the ear to 'e'.
- Work the second ear from 'f' to 'g'.
- 5 Mount the rabbit on felt or card, and mark on the features.
- 6 Cut green felt for the grass and white or pink for the tail and glue in position.






Bushy-tailed Squirrel

Thread: Fil a dentelle

9 pairs of bobbins for the head, body and tail 5 pairs for the paw


Red Squirrel

This pattern was given to us by Jean Markham of Leeds when we met at the Convention in Weston-Super-Mare last April. Thank you very much Jean. He's beautiful.

The picture is worked in Sylko, an ordinary sewing cotton. The braid outlines are worked in cloth stitch using five pairs. The arrows show the starting point for each section. The branch needed as many as 11 pairs, and Jean used raised tallies as well as holes and veins to give a bark-like texture. The ears are half-stitch with that characteristic tuft which only red squirrels have.

The squirrel was worked in this order:

- 1. Branch
- 2. Large ear
- 3. Body back
- 4. Tail
- 5. Head
- 6. Leg
- 7. Haunch
- 8. Chest
- 9. Small ear
- 10. Eye and nose/mouth




Cute Mouse








'Whiskers the Otter'
