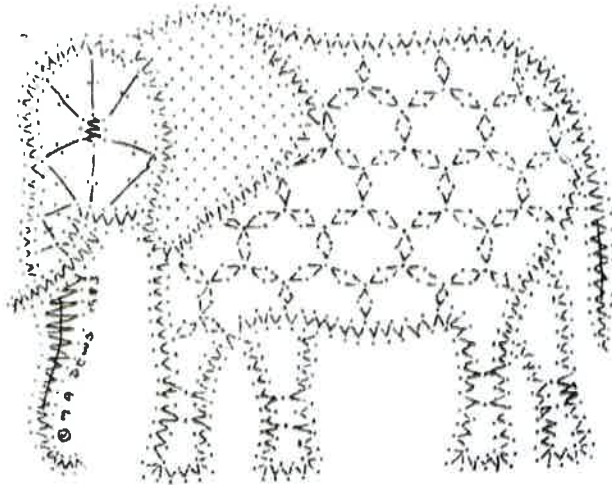
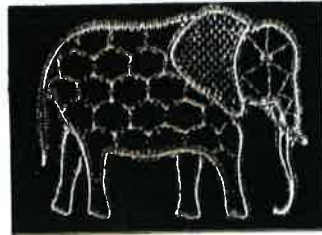

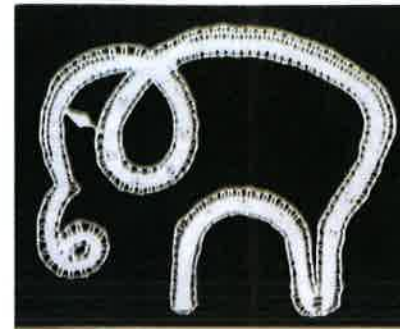

 has 7 pairs.

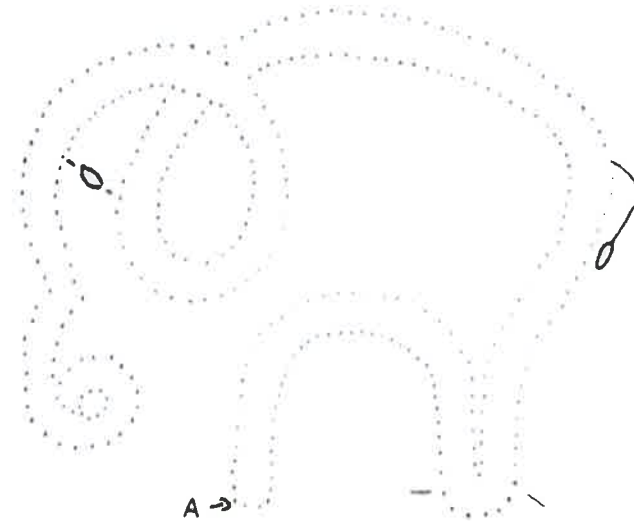

## Cute Elephant

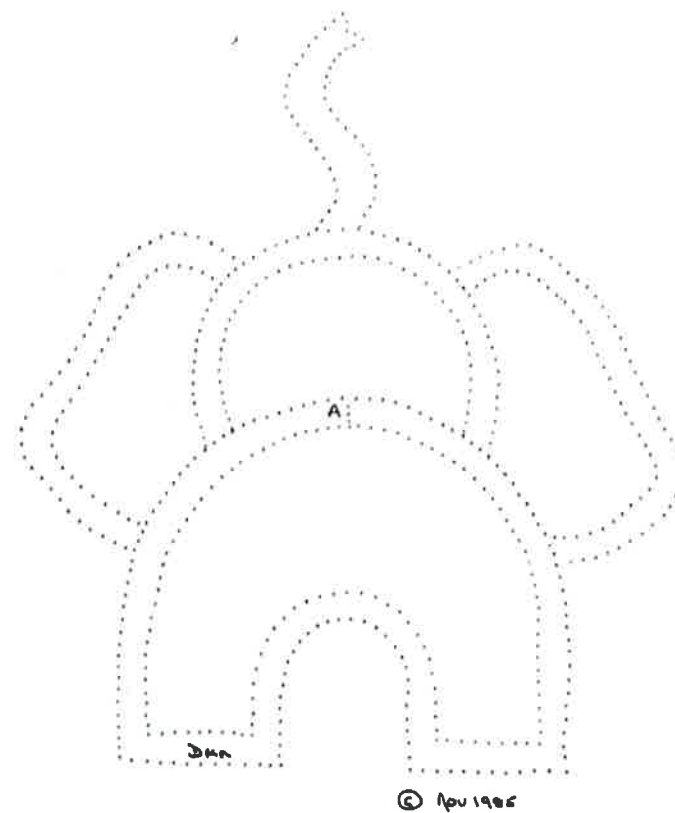
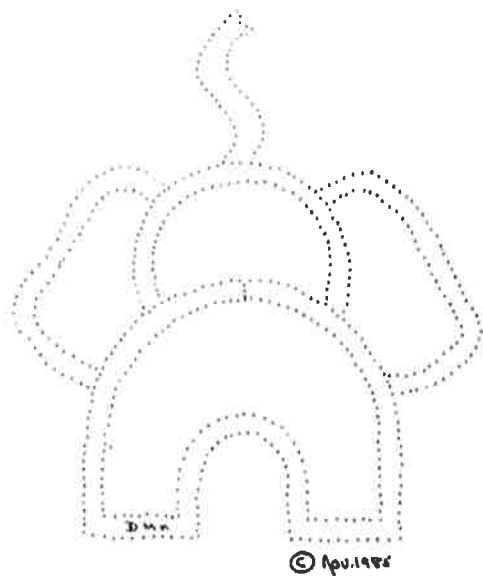
You will need:

6 pairs of bobbins

DMC Retors d'Alsace No 30 thread

Work the tapes as shown in the finished picture. Special note to finish tail -

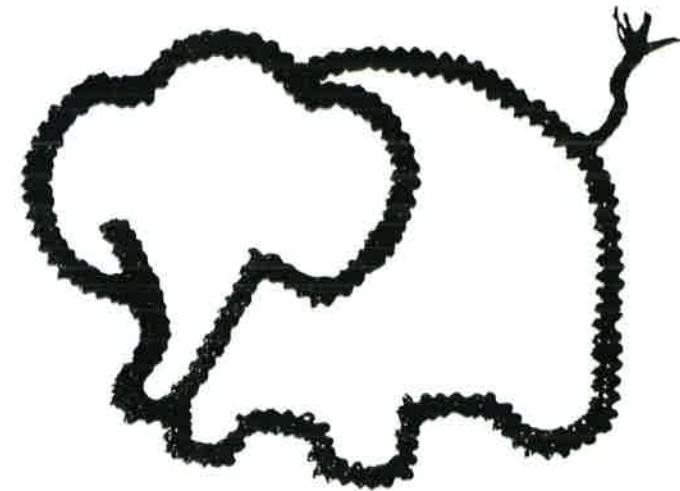
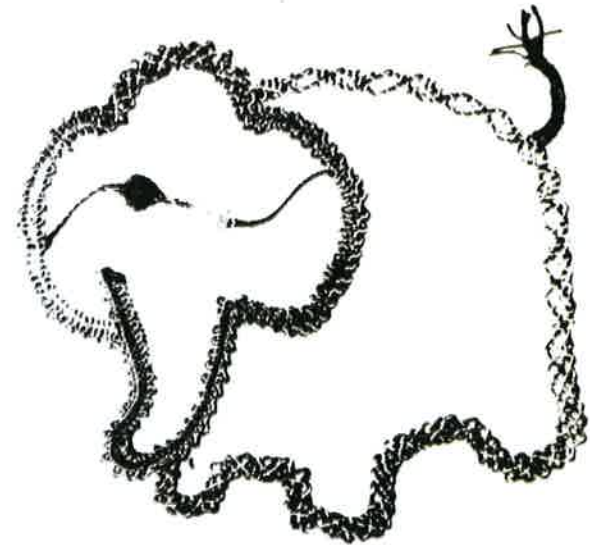
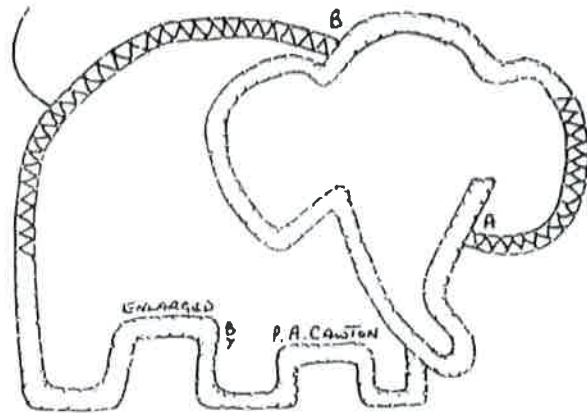
Start at the top of the body at point A. Work round the body and make sewings to fasten. DO NOT CUT THREADS. Divide these threads into four and make a half stitch plait for the tail. Bunch the bobbins and using one pair of bobbins tie around the bunch to form a tassel. Cut off threads as in the picture.

The pattern has been worked by a Young Lacemaker - Marianne Garside (age 14), who chose to use a pink variegated thread for one elephant - a pink elephant and a blue single coloured thread for the other. She used 3 pairs of bobbins for the passives and one pair for the weavers. For the blue elephant she chose to use only two passives for the body, but twisting the weavers in-between working the passives.

Start the Lace at A with the elephant's head work around the head and sew in at his trunk. Sew threads in at B and work his body. Finally sew threads in for his tail and work a few stitches, tie off and leave a short end to each thread for the end of the tail.

3 or 4 pairs of bobbins for  
the braids round the outline  
Extra pairs for the plaits and  
half stitch rings in the mid-  
dle

DMC Broder Machine 50  
or similar

Work round the head first  
then work the  
braids in the  
following order

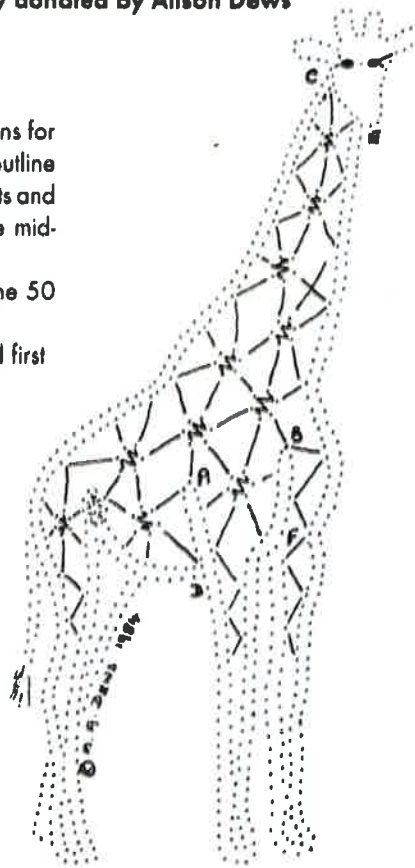
A to B \*

C to D

E to F

Finally the tail and  
the outline of the  
hind leg

\* At B put aside 2  
pairs to use later  
for the zigzag  
down front leg at  
F



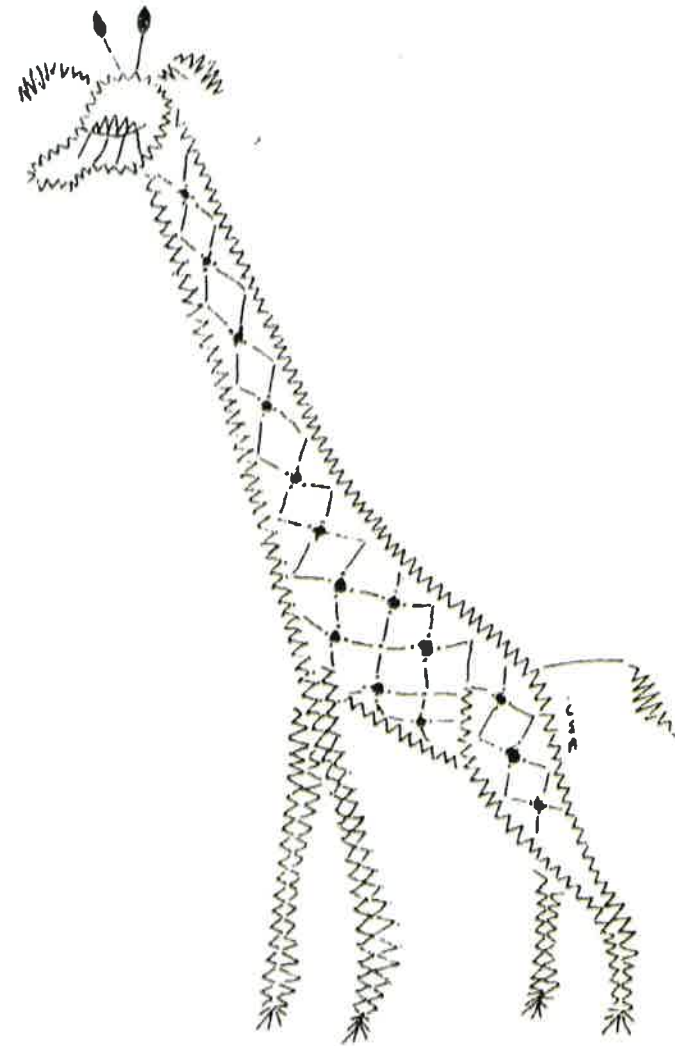
